## VIRG ANDERSON Granite Bay Municipal Advisory Council (MAC)

There are seven members on the Council, chosen by the County Board of Supervisors. Members

serve for 2 years without compensation. There is a Parks Subcommittee. Virg thanked our Club, especially MIKE B., for helping get the new parks completed. One of the recent major projects is the widening of Auburn-Folsom Road. The first phase was budgeted at \$7 million and came in under \$5 million. Supervisor Kirk Uhler successfully sought regional funds for future phases. A project under consideration is a large Catholic Church at Auburn-Folsom and Cavitt Stallman. The proposed car wash on Douglas across from Berg Road has been approved, and two more car washes along Douglas have applied. MAC doesn't evaluate business decisions, only whether it is allowed and would be good for the community. Amazing Facts Ministry would like to build a Church the size of Bayside near the top of Sierra College Boulevard on 40 acres, which has been approved by MAC. A senior community has been proposed north of Oakhills School, but residents are concerned about density. The Granite Bay Community Plan written in 1988 is 9 years overdue for review. They want to get the entire community involved through the internet. June 30 was the deadline for input. The Council meets the first Wednesday every month at the Eureka Union School District Office. Community gatherings are held at the Lutheran Church of the Resurrection on Douglas.

Some of the statistics must be updated, such as the projection of 25,000 people by 2005, which wasn't achieved, and then projected out 10 years. Churches are allowed in Residential Zones with a Use Permit.
